What are three top highlights of your life? (1) My Grandkids (2) Going to the beach (3) Sleep

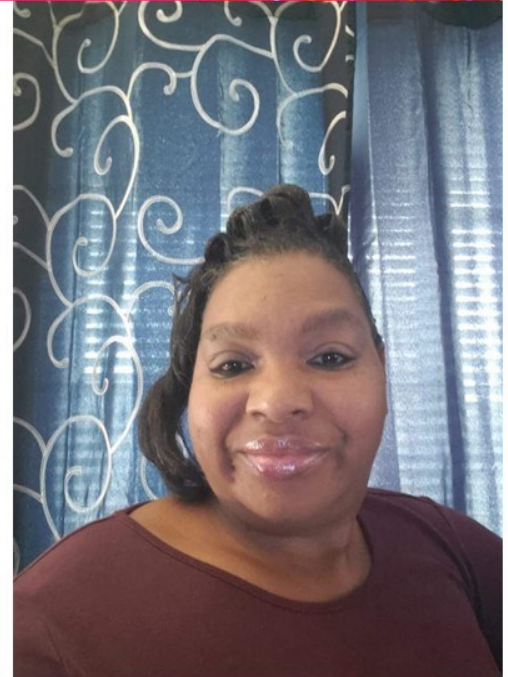
