A Note From The Family Service Department


Hospice care focuses on a team approach to serving patients. When people think of hospice, often, they think of the hospice nurse. Another aspect to hospice care, however, involves family services. The Family Services Department consist of the following: Social Work, Chaplain, Bereavement and Volunteer services. Social Workers offer additional support to patients/families as well as community resource linkage and education and assistance with advance directives. Chaplain services are offered as an additional support to patients and their family. The Chaplain can work in coordination with the patient's already established spiritual support to address all spiritual needs of the patient. Bereavement care is offered to patients prior to their death as well as to family members for up to 13 months after a patient has passed away. This program offers telephone support, grief support mailings and visits, as requested by the family. Finally, volunteer services serve as a vital part of Volunteers can choose from a variety of ways in which to share their time and talents, including office support, special events and patient care volunteers. Hospice care is a team approach and seeks to provide a holistic approach to care. The Family Services Department assist with promoting our mission of providing peace, comfort, and dignity to our patients.
